This amazing slide-illustrated lecture will take you back in time and show you the development of gardens from ancient Roman times to the present. It will take you through the Middle Ages into the Italian Renaissance and the French formal garden. You will see some examples of English landscape gardens, French picturesque gardens, American parks by Fredrick Law Olmsted, and some modern landscapes. This program will explain the differences in garden styles and their development.

Adriana O'Sullivan is an artist, landscape designer, gardener, and lecturer who has been living and gardening in New England for more than 25 years. Originally from Holland, she earned a degree from the Royal Academy of Fine Arts and Design in The Netherlands. She is also a graduate of The Landscape Institute of the Arnold Arboretum at Harvard University with a Certificate in Landscape Design.

She has worked as a garden designer/consultant/lecturer for the past 15 years, both professionally and as a volunteer in her community, the town of Sharon. Adriana offers a variety of lectures and slide programs on gardening subjects like horticulture, gardening techniques, garden history, Dutch gardens and other gardens around the world. Her landscape design experience includes both commercial and residential landscapes, as well as public plantings. Her garden has been featured in several Garden Tours by the Sharon Garden Club as well as the Garden Club Federation of Massachusetts.
